Scammers advertise jobs in the same places honest employers do—in online ads, on job sites, and through social media. They promise you a job, but what they want is your money. Some of the most common employment scams feature work-from-home offers. Scammers claim you can make thousands of dollars a month working from home with little time and effort. But instead of making money, you end up spending it on starter kits, so-called training, or worthless certifications.

To avoid getting scammed:

- Search online. Look up the name of the company or the person who's hiring you, plus the words "scam," "review," or "complaint."
- Talk to someone you trust.

 Describe the offer to them.

 What do they think?
- Don't pay for the promise of a job. Honest employers, including the federal government, will never ask you to pay to get a job.

While looking for employment, one of your jobs is to watch for scams.


